"Applying" Anthropology**

Applied Anthropology involves putting anthropology "to work," or into "practice," to work with the public to solve community, regional and global problems. Applied work spans all fields of anthropology. Applied Anthropologists work in economic development, community planning, business, tourism, refugee camps, in programs providing health care and educational assistance to communities and groups, in cultural preservation and resource management, in forensics, and many other areas in which anthropological knowledge and methods for studying human behavior and culture can be put to use.

ANTH 361 class provides an introduction to the field of Applied Anthropology. It covers the history, research issues, and current directions in Applied Anthropology. **Students will study areas of Applied Anthropology to discover potential career interests and paths.**
